Pre-Session Activity: Make advanced group reservations at www.TIGERSNYC.com

- TIGERS Interactive worksheets will be sent electronically to the group leader to print and bring to TIGERS Exhibition.
- Visitors can bring their camera to create a journal of their TIGERS adventure.

| 5 min | Activity 1: Talk like a Tiger Interactive- Select and imitate a tiger (cub, tigress or male tiger) sound. Compare your sound with the tiger’s sound on spectrogram to see high and low (infrasound) frequency patterns.
How many distinct sounds do tigers use to communicate with each other? |
| 5 min | Activity 2: Carnivore Capture - Jaws and Claws Experience the Tiger’s Hunt.
How does the “LOCK” tiger hunt sequence work to capture prey? |
| 5 min | Activity 3: Canine Bite Force Learn the science of canine bite force strength.
What different teeth do tigers use to catch and eat prey? |
| 15 min | Activity 4: Inside the Tiger Exhibit - Explore the tiger’s head, heart, chest and abdomen by viewing rare “CAT” Scans on a sliding monitor.
ABDOMEN – How much food can a tiger eat in one sitting and how fast does it digest the food? |
| 15 min | Activity 5: Tiger’s Cave - Learn about a Day in the Life of the Tigress & Cubs.
