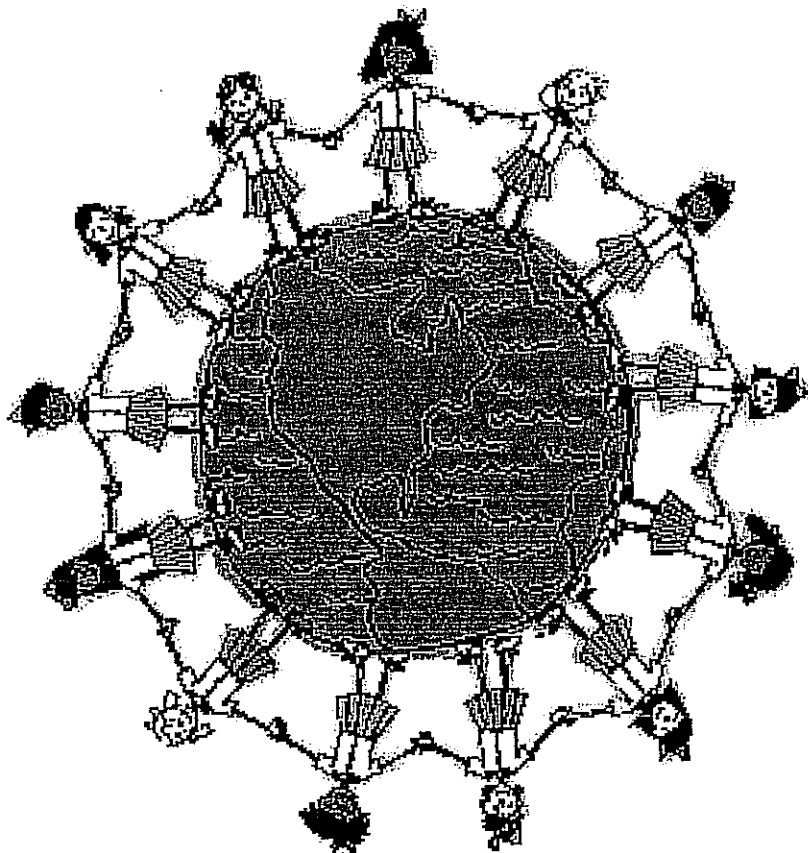

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

This Leader's Weekend is being offered to registered Leaders, Co Leaders and adult volunteers active in Girl Scouting at a cost of \$65.00 per person. Please make your check out to **GSCGNY** and send to **Maria Dawson, 91-16 Woodhaven Blvd., NY 11421**. The fees are **non refundable**, however, they may be transferred to another leader attending the weekend.

Because of rising costs, the \$65.00 charge includes your lodging, food and patch. If you want a Golf shirt with a screened logo, there will be an additional cost of \$17.00. These monies are separate from your accommodations, see attached letter.

When registering please keep in mind that this weekend is an experience in outdoor fun and learning, therefore, all cars will be left in the parking lot and participants will be required to walk around camp. With this in mind, comfortable shoes and clothing are necessary. Camp Henry Kaufmann is hilly and you should be prepared to get around camp on foot. Yet, we encourage everyone who is able to attend.

TRAVEL: There are two ways of getting to Camp Kaufmann – drive, (car pool that you arrange with your friends) or Council bus. If you will be using the bus, your bus stop information will be sent with your confirmation letter. **There will be an additional fee of \$40.00 for those who use the bus.**

SLEEPING ARRANGEMENTS: Your registration form has three types of sleeping arrangements. Your preference will be met where possible. If you are coming with friends, please specify on the reservation form who you want to room with, and if possible, send reservations together. If you want house accommodations please return your registration as quickly as possible.
First come, first serve basis.

REMARKER: All units have bunk bed. If you are capable of using an upper bunk, please leave the bottom bunks for those who cannot climb.

MEALS: Dinner will be brown bag on Friday, three meals will be provided on Saturday, and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. Snacks/drinks will be available at other times. Any dietary limitation, for either religious or medical reasons, will be accommodated, whenever possible.

PHYSICAL LIMITATIONS/MEDICATIONS: Please indicate on your registration any physical limitations and/or medications of which the First Aiders should be aware.

There will be a First Aider and House Mother in each unit. They are there to help you with any problems. Meet them on Friday night.

No one is allowed in the kitchen area. Coffee, Tea and Hot Chocolate will be available in **"COOKIE HALL."**

Workshops will be limited to 20 or less participants. Some workshops may be canceled due to lack of participation.

The Trading Post hours will be announced on the weekend.

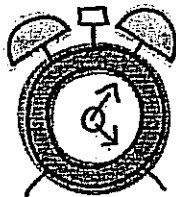

SESSION A

FRIDAY NIGHT

A1. GIFT BOXES: come let your imagination soar with making Small Gift Boxes from old Greeting Cards.

A2. SWEET DREAMS AT CAMP: take a deep breath, close your eyes and then.....Make a travel pillow from a bandana.
NEED TO BRING: Bandana, 6 oz (1/2 regular bag) fiberfill stuffing and a large sharp pair of scissors.

A3. CEREMONIES CORNER: basics for planning and implementing Ceremonies for troop meetings and special occasions.

A4. MUSE BAGS: with a needle and thread, bandana and shoelaces we'll fashion a bag to carry your odds and ends.
NEED TO BRING: bandana and sport shoelaces.

A5. GIRL SCOUT YARN DOLL PIN: make a Girl Scout yarn pin from scraps of yarn.

A6. DONUT MAKING: see how easy it is to make donuts.

A7. BEADED ROOM FRESHENER: freshens any place
NEED TO BRING: a bar of Dove soap.



SESSION B

SATURDAY MORNING

B1. GIRL SCOUTING ON A SHOESTRING: learn many quick, inexpensive and fun activities to use with your troop.

NEED TO BRING: participants need a clean, empty, large, Pringles-like can, a small bag of dried beans (your choice of variety) from the grocery store, tacky glue, 30 caps from soda bottles, scissors and a sharpie marker.

B2. COOPERATIVE GAMES FOR ALL AGES: by leading problem solving games, games that involve the "whole team", etc.

NEED TO BRING: bandana or fabric scrap.

B3. THE WORLD OF HIKING: explore the world beyond your unit on the lesser known camp trails, such as Box Turtle Bog Trail-approximately 3-4 mile hike. This workshop is 3 hours. We will eat on the trail. Be prepared for a moderate hike, including hills and rough terrain. Wear layers, hiking boots or sturdy shoes/sneakers, bring water bottle, base plate compass (if you have), knife (optional) and backpack. You will back in time for your afternoon workshop.

B4. BUGMAN'S BOTANY BASICS: itching to know about plants? Join Camp Kaufmann's nature specialist on a search for edible, medicinal, and even poisonous plants near the Frog Pond and Cookie Hall.

NEED TO BRING: Dress for the weather and bring your camera.

B5. LEATHER WORKSHOP: decorate leather bracelets, key rings and more.

B6. RECYCLED HOT PLATES: join us and learn to make hot plates out of plastic tops of 6-pack soda cans. You should be able to do a double crochet stitch.

NEED TO BRING: an 'H' crochet hook and a skein of worsted weight yarn (4-ply). If you want two-toned hot plates you can share. Great craft for older girls, who can crochet or might want to learn.

B7. GIRL SCOUT THEME TRINKETS: while making swaps girls are learning about symbols in scouting which are based on Girl Scout foundations and values. They can be used in Ceremonies also.

NEED TO BRING: scissors and ruler.

B8. BROWNIE GIRLS PRESERVING THE PLANET: learn Brownie Crafts that make recycling a fun project. *NEED TO BRING:* empty soda bottle 1 or 2 liter.

B9. ADORABLE SOCK DOGS: are you looking for a traveling companion? Well look no more! Come and create your own personal traveling buddy. This cute little fellow will follow you anywhere. Bring you spirit of fun and adventure and see what comes of it.

NEED TO BRING: a pair of interest dress socks (the crazier the pattern the better), a pair of scissors. If you have any unmatched dress socks bring them also to create some accessories for your new pal.

B10. DRIED FLOWERS & SMALL PICTURES: take a chance and see what develops.

B11. SINGING THROUGH THE CAMP: start at the lake houses and end at the Peace Garden. *Optional:* tape recorder

B12. SCARF & HAT: winter is coming
NEED TO BRING: 1yd of fleece material.

B13. CADETTE/SENIOR STUDIO 2B: explains itself

B14. ARCHERY: a new activity at camp. Limit 10 per session



SESSION C

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

C1. JEANS WORKSHOP: don't throw away the old jeans use those resources wisely! Recycle a pair of old jeans into a shoulder bag or backpack. Bring your own trimmings or use ours.

NEED TO BRING: old jeans, sharp scissors and trimmings (optional)

C2. SOAP MAKING: do you want clean and happy scouts? I will show you how to make the soap.

C3. WHAT'S UNDER THE LOG? BUGMAN KNOWS! a walk in the woods (or a city park) can be lots more fun if you know where to look. Wear comfortable shoes, dress for the weather, and bring your camera.

C4. LEATHER WORKSHOP: create a beautiful bracelet or key ring from leather.

C5. FISHING FUN WITH LADYBUG: learn a sport that you can share with your girls, even in the city! "Freshwater- catch and release fishing". Learn the basics and make your own inexpensive equipment.

NEED TO BRING: 20oz recycle plastic bottle with cap (vitamin water or any bottle with a groove in the center is preferable.) (Total people 20 max)

C6. WASHING WELL POTPOURRI HOLDER: see what can be done with baby jars, clothes pins, flowers, potpourri and a little imagination.

NEED TO BRING: small baby food bottle & glue gun

C7. INTERNATIONAL GAMES: games from around the world.

C8. KEEP IT GOING ROUND: Participants will design a wreath.

NEED TO BRING: 3 yards of wired ribbon (for bow), glue gun, glue sticks, scissors, wire cutters (a plus).

C9. ORGANIZING SCRAPBOOK: it's a small square book, very unique in the way it folds.

NEED TO BRING: paper glue sticks

C10. TIE-DYEING THE EASY WAY: bring your imagination.

NEED TO BRING: old t-shirt or new pre-washed one, socks-cotton is best.

C11. CANDLES & COMPASS: dip a candle & learn to use a compass.

C12. PEACEFUL SONGS: quiet and peaceful songs sung at the Peace Garden. *Optional:* tape recorder

C13. ARCHERY: a new activity at camp. Limit 10 per session

C14. GLASS PENDENT: a beautiful piece of jewelry
NEED TO BRING: a pair of small scissors and a 1" x 1 1/2 photo of their child, parent, spouse, etc.

SESSION D

SUNDAY MORNING

D1. COVERED WIRE HANGERS: a great way to use wire hangers and leftover yarn.....make beautiful covered hangers with items you already have in your home. It's easy, it is kind to your clothes and looks great. You will receive other supplies on site. It is an easy way to pass the time and create a personal item. *NEED TO BRING:* 2 wire hangers (matched) and yarn.

D2. SIMPLE MACRAME: use knots for a beautiful decoration, flower pot holder or wall hanging.

D3. CERAMICE & CLAY JUNIOR BADGE: create and paint a badge that you don't wear.

D4. NO COOK COOKING: who says that you have to use a stove when making food, try a new way.

D5. SWIVEL BRACELET: who says that using a fishing swivel is only use to catch fish.

D6. FOSSIL PRINTS: make your own fossil with plaster of paris

D7. BIRTHPLACE BOUND: JULIETTE LOW'S SAVANNAH- THE 100TH Anniversary of Girl Scouting is just 5 years away. See what the historic district of Savannah looks like. Learn what you will be doing when you take your GS troop to visit the Juliette Low Birthplace.

D8. ARCHERY: a new activity at camp. Limit 10 per session

ALL DAY COURSES

ADVANCED OUTDOOR COOKING: (PRE-REQUISITE- All outdoor series of trainings.) Learn more advanced ways to cook at camp.

CARIBBEAN COOKING CAMP STYLE: Do you enjoy island hopping? If so, stop by Kaufmann Beach! Sun, sand & jerked or curried chicken with ground provisions. Come prepare lunch outdoors and enjoy the flavors of the Caribbean!

These courses includes lunch, it is a possibility that you might be able to take an afternoon course if there is time.

WHAT TO BRING: Pack clothing and equipment in either a duffel bag or backpack.

Remember: Your name and unit must be clearly visible. The Girl Scout Council of Greater New York is not responsible for lost items.

WHAT TO WEAR: Our surroundings will be rustic, and we are participating in an outdoor weekend. Therefore, clothing should be comfortable and practical. Wear layers of clothing which can be removed or added for comfort.

Turn left up hill

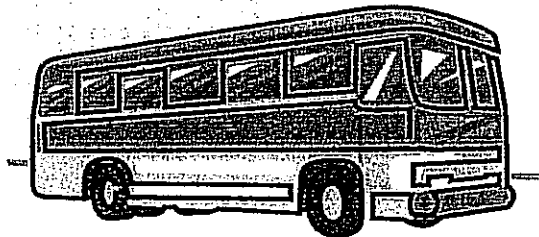
Entrance to Camp Henry Kaufmann is on the right, opposite

COUNCIL BUS
