What is the *Panwapa*?

Panwapa is produced in partnership with the Merrill Lynch Foundation. It is a Worldwide Kids initiative designed to engage and inspire children to become global citizens. By stimulating their curiosity about the wider world-its cultures and traditions, its languages, and imagery, its triumphs, and inequities-Panwapa can develop the start of a lifelong engagement with the world. Being a global citizen enriches our own lives, as well as the lives of others.

How does *the Panwapa program* work with the Girl Scouts?

You can choose to participate in the program at your own troop meeting. You can also choose to participate in a one-day event offered during the Girl Scout year.

The Panwapa program for Daisy Girl Scouts will help girls:

- € Understand and respond to economic differences
- € Take responsibility and develop empathy
- € Build awareness of the wider world
- € Participate in the community
- € Recognize everyone's common humanity

By using the Panwapa materials to teach and engage children, you can help and encourage them to become Panwapa kids who:

- € Are curious to explore the different people, languages, and traditions around them, starting with their own culture.
- € Delight in the diversity of the world because it offers infinite possibilities for fun and wonder.
- € Understand that many children-where they live and elsewhere in the world-do not have all of the things they need to live safely and comfortably.
- € Know that they should do their best to help make the world a fairer, safer place for all people.
- € Want to have their voice heard and respected at home, in their community, and beyond.
- € Believe their actions, large and small, have the power to change the way things are in the community, their nation, and around the world.

What is included in the *Panwapa* program?

The Panwapa program for Daisy Girl Scouts includes a folder which contains the Panwapa magazine, a cd-rom, a game board, and a map. Leaders will also receive a leader guide to help them facilitate 5 of the activities included in the curriculum.

How do I request the *Panwapa* program?

Is there a fee for the *Panwapa* program?

What is the procedure for ordering the *Panwapa* patch for my troop?

Although the patches for this program are free, postage fees apply to free patches. In order to receive the patches you will have to fill out the patch order form and send the completed form along with the payment as well as the Panwapa evaluation to: **Girl Scout Council of Greater New York, 43 West 23rd Street New York, NY 10010 Attn: Nicole Torres.** Upon receipt of your Panwapa evaluation and payment, patches will then be mailed out.
